



Welcome!

Welcome to Three Rivers Village School! We are so pleased to have your family as part of our school community. Please read through this handbook carefully, and feel free to contact a staff member with any questions.



COVID-19 Safety at School

The Health & Safety Plan outlines the pandemic-related precautions and practices that will guide our operations during the pandemic. The Plan and the school's practices may be revised by the school from time to time, based on experience and evolving guidance from external authorities.

Hygiene and Face Masks

- Face coverings are required as specified in this Plan or as ordered by state officials, whichever is more restrictive.
- A supply of single-use face masks will be available to all.
- Staff, students, and visitors are required to wear face coverings except when outdoors (with social distancing) and when eating.
- "In-your-elbow" protocol required (for sneeze and cough) when not wearing a face covering.
- Hand sanitizer will be available.



Covid and Attendance

- Students and staff are not permitted to attend school if they are exhibiting symptoms of COVID-19 or have tested positive.
- The Medical Officer may send home any person exhibiting symptoms of COVID-19.
- Students and staff who have been absent from school because of their COVID-19 symptoms or positive test shall not return until **ten days** after the positive test or the start of symptoms.
- Students and staff awaiting the results of COVID-19 testing related to symptoms or exposure should stay home until they receive a negative test *and* remain symptom-free for 48 hours.
- The Medical Officer may exclude from school any persons deemed to have had close contact with an active or suspected case of COVID-19.
- Any Covid-related absences that exceed our normal attendance policy limits will be excused by the school if reported as such.

School Hours and Attendance Requirements

School hours are 8:30am until 4:00pm Monday through Friday.

Students must attend the school for at least the number of hours specified by PA school law:

Age	Required hours per day
5 and under	3.25
6-13	5.75
14-18	6.25

Excused Absences

Whenever possible, please notify the school prior to a planned absence or on the day of an unplanned absence. Students who are absent from school are expected to account for their absence to the Attendance Clerk in writing on the day of the student's return to school.

The Attendance Clerk may excuse no more than **ten family-approved absences** per student per year. Absences beyond ten may only be excused for religious holidays, covid-related concerns, or with a doctor's note that explicitly excuses school attendance for a specific amount of time.

In accordance with state law, the Attendance Clerk must notify the student's home school



district if a student accumulates three unlawful absences during the school year, or if a student's hours reflect the equivalent of more than ten cumulative absences during the school year.

Off-Campus Activities

TRVS allows students to pursue activities beyond the walls of the school such as a family trip, a class, a part time job, an apprenticeship, etc. These must be approved by the Attendance Clerk prior to the planned activity in order to count as school attendance, and must take place with adult supervision. Please ask if you would like the OCA form!



School Delays and Closings

TRVS follows Pittsburgh Public Schools for weather-related cancellations and delays. In the case of an unplanned school closing or delayed opening that affects only TRVS, the school will send a text via Remind to parents.

Busing

Morning and afternoon busing is available to students through their home school district. The district must be within 10 miles of TRVS and provide busing to its own students. Check your school district's website to find out more about busing options for your child. If students qualify through their home districts, TRVS staff will arrange bus transportation upon request of the parents.

If your child lives within the Pittsburgh Public School District and relies on busing for transportation, please read the PPS COVID-19 Transportation Code of Conduct with your child and ensure that they are familiar with it.

Parents are responsible for alerting their bus company if a student who receives transportation will not be riding the bus for any reason, including symptoms of COVID-19.

Evacuation

In the case of an emergency evacuation, TRVS students and staff will exit the building and cross the street to the playground. Staff will notify parents as soon as possible, and parents can arrange to pick up their child there.



Medication

If a student needs to bring medications to school, they must turn them over to the Safety Clerk immediately upon arrival at school. The Safety Clerk will secure the medication and supervise access.

Medications include:

- drugs and medicines both oral and topical
- vitamins and supplements whose original packaging identifies an active ingredient or warns "Keep out of reach of children" on the packaging

All medications should bear the original label and the name of the child receiving the medication.

Spare Clothing

Students may store seasonally appropriate extra clothes in their personal storage crate or in the coatroom. We strongly recommend that children under 10 keep extra clothes at school at all times.



Illness

IMPORTANT: Please do not send your child to school if they are showing any symptoms of illness.

Symptoms of COVID-19 include: cough, fever, chills, difficulty breathing, fatigue, sore throat, congestion, runny nose, vomiting, diarrhea, loss of taste or smell, and/or body aches.



If your child becomes ill at school, TRVS staff will contact you to come and pick them up. If you are unavailable, we will call those listed on the Emergency Contact form. If your child is coughing, vomiting, or has a fever, please refer to the COVID-19 safety procedures in the Health & Safety Plan.

Head lice will be treated like an illness; the parent or their designee must pick the child up immediately. They must be completely lice-free before returning to school.

Toileting Accidents

If a student is soiled or wet they will be expected to change into their clean clothes. Students will be expected to clean themselves up independently. If a student is soiled with feces, they will be given baby wipes to clean themselves up independently. TRVS will contact you or those listed on their emergency form for immediate pick up. Students must be bathed and completely clean before returning to school. All soiled clothes will be placed in a bag to be taken home that day.

Get Involved!

Parents can participate in the TRVS community in a variety of ways:

Enjoy a Lunch Hour With Your Child

Students may invite their parents and guardians for hour-long lunch visits up to twice a month. Students must accompany their guests for the duration of the visit. The Attendance Clerk must be informed of the visit no later than the day before.



Share a Resource

Parents who are interested in leading a class, workshop, activity, or other resource for TRVS students are invited to complete a Resource Form describing their idea. This form should be submitted to the school office, and will be stored in the Resource Binder for students to review. Students initiate all activities, and the student or Resource Clerk will contact you if a student would like to utilize your resource. Please contact the school for a Resource Form if you have not filled one out already.

Volunteer

We greatly appreciate help from volunteers for cleaning days and school improvements. We will announce these volunteer opportunities as needed.

Please help out with as much as you can. Our staff is small and we need your support to maintain and grow our school community. Staff will reach out directly for help with scheduled events or predictable needs, but please do not hesitate to offer assistance whenever you are available!



Fundraising
